DROP OFF & PICK UP AT SCHOOL

Many things are happening in and around our school and the construction of our new classroom block is moving ahead rapidly. The extension of our Te Whare Tapere is also due to begin this term and this will add to our car parking challenges. Please note that the Verge Factory on Monmouth St is currently vacant. In this transition, I ask that if you are leaving your vehicle to collect your children from the class, please use a carpark, leaving the drive through area for those who stay in their cars and drop off or pick up their children quickly.

To assist in alleviating the inconvenience of getting out of your cars to pick up your child from their class, we would like to offer the option of empowering our senior students in the Transport Department of our student council to collect younger students from their class and accompanying them to the Drop Off Zone (The Verge Carpark) adjacent to our Pedestrian Crossing. If you would like to use this option, please contact [Julie](#), our school receptionist to indicate that you'd like your child to be picked up and waiting for you. To ensure this works:

- Only parents picking up children from the roadside should access the Verge Carpark. Do not get out of your car.
- Parents must pick up your child between 3.00pm & 3.10pm.
- You **must** contact the school office if you will be late or have made alternative arrangements for picking up your child.
