

## TE RA - Essential Behaviour Principles

1. All we do is behave.
2. Behaviour is learned.
3. Behaviour must be observable and measurable.
4. Behaviour tends to be triggered by an 'event' around (or in) us.
5. Behaviour is purposeful and depends on the context and the person's behaviour skill set.
6. Behaviour is controlled (weakened or reinforced) by what happens after it (consequences).
7. Managing challenging behaviour is often unsuccessful because because we try to manage the form (what) of the behaviour rather than the function (why).
8. We can never directly manage another's behaviour. We can only...
  - Teach missing social skills
  - Adjust the context to better support positive behaviour

As we know, with limited car parks, construction and continued scrutiny from traffic wardens, carparking is an ongoing concern for all members of our community. While the Walking School Bus has provided an additional option in some areas of our neighbourhood, pick-ups remain a significant challenge. To assist in alleviating the inconvenience of getting out of your cars to pick up your child from their class, we would like to offer the option of empowering our senior students in the Transport Department of our student council to collect younger students from their class and accompanying them to the Drop Off Zone (The Verge Carpark) adjacent to our Pedestrian Crossing. If you'd like to use this option, please contact [Julie](#), our school receptionist to indicate that you'd like your child picked up and be waiting for you. To ensure this works:

- Only parents picking up children from the roadside should access the Verge Carpark do not get out of your car.
- Parents must pick up your child between 3.00pm & 3.10pm
- You **must** contact the school office if you will be late or have made alternative arrangements for picking up your child
