Charter Schools update

Board to document their thinking and rationale for a decision not to become a charter school.

- A feature of charter schools where teachers don't need to be qualified teachers.
- More limited funding pool.
 A charter school may get more funding, but at the expense of other schools in the same community.

Revisit whether the current settings and proposed changes still assist us in meeting the objectives determined under cogovernance principles.

How do we protect our focus on Māori achievement?

Allocate time at the next Board hui to discuss charter schools and finalise position on charter schools. Board members to research prior to the discussion. Following that, Board to consider communication or consultation required with the community.

Ti Tiriti principles bill — a template is being developed across kahui ako. If appropriate, could be shared with the tumuaki and across the community for whanau to submit on the bill.
